In Memory of Mark and Christianna Forster Halfpenny presented by Kate Halfpenny

This stained glass window resides behind the sanctuary organ. Mark Halfpenny built the Winfield Woolen Factory on Laurel Run (near Laurelton) in 1851 where he also ran a sumac mill (sumac extract was used in the tanning process) and a store. The mills were destroyed by fire and Halfpennys relocated to Lewisburg. The 1860 census shows that living in the household was the couple, their 9 children, grandfather and a domestic servant. Only some of the family actually became members of the church. Kate was the only daughter of Mark & Christianna and never married. She had eight brothers.
