We worship a God who has done the greatest act of Love in all of history, has done amazing things in our lives, and is still working in each of our lives.



"WAITING TO BE WANTED"

In a recent sermon, a pinchhit appearance for Pastor Jim King, I reminded the older members of the congregation how we once played neighborhood games without adults drafting our teams. In a "pickup" game, two big kids took turns choosing their lineups from the group until they were down to someone's younger brother, the smallest and least experienced player on the block, the one destined to bat last and play right field. After the service, several people with "right-field" experience, shared stories with me. One said with some satisfaction, "I was a right-fielder, but the guys treated me with respect: I owned the bat and the ball. "

Come to think of it, aren't we all "right-fielders" at different times during our lives? Think of all those initiations you have experienced—from the rude shock of entering the world on down through infancy, childhood, school, friendships, com-

petitions for places on teams and in honor societies, the first palpitations of puppy love, the departure from home to college or job, and the waiting for a promotion. Then one day you find yourself waiting to see what part of the family or what institution will open its doors to you in your final years.

Here's a happier thought. In our relationship with God, we are never consigned to right field. No tense waiting for His acceptance. No voodoo initiations. No upper echelons of believers to demand our respect. God cut through the red tape of the Pharisees and all their descendants once and for all by sending His "Word," His Son, to earth to show us that all of our anxieties over being accepted are resolved in Him. He is the source of love and the One who, regardless of what stage of "right-field" life we are experiencing, holds us in His arms. If we place our trust in Him and allow Him to guide

us, through His Holy Spirit, then we are prepared to be less puffed up when the world applauds us and less deflated when it passes us over.

Because of God's love for us, we at First Presbyterian are a team of equals, encouraging one another through study and prayer, enjoying one another's company, and gaining strength from one another as we step out in service to many different communities. We are both a haven for wounded and sinful people, coming in out of the wind and cold, and an outpost for spreading God's vital message of love and acceptance to hurting people all over the world. If for any reason you haven't felt this love, please come in from "right-field" immediately. Talk to me, Pastor King, or another member of your choice.
