# **A Remembrance**

Richard Merritt, pastor at First Presbyterian Lewisburg from 1964-1976, passed away after a long illness on May 5, 2016, in New Jersey. Rev. Merritt was 86. He is survived by his former wife, Florence; and his daughters, Heather Gallagher and Gwen Buchanan and their families.

Born in Paterson, New Jersey, Dick Merritt served in the armed forces before attending Princeton Theological Seminary. He then pastored faithfully at three Presbyterian churches: McAlevys Fort, PA; Lewisburg, PA; and Great Valley Presbyterian Church, Malvern, PA.

Known for his kindness to all and his ability to communicate the grace and love of Christ to his congregations, Dick had a deep impact on his churches, on the Intervarsity communities he served at Penn State and at Bucknell Universities, and throughout the local community. His sermons, blending scriptural insight, humor, and a deep love of literature, stirred the mind and the soul in equal measures. Very much a man of letters, Dick also had a passion for jazz, Mel Brooks, baseball, Lewisburg softball, locomotives, and his hometown hot Texas wieners.

A memorial service for Dick was held at Great Valley Presbyterian Church, Malvern, PA, on Friday, May 20, 2016, at 11 a.m. [West Chester Daily Local News Obituary]

### Additional Comments from Friends:

"Following Dick Merritt at First Presbyterian Lewisburg was a challenging experience. I never hoped to 'fill his shoes' – I simply enjoyed his friendship, humor, wisdom, and preaching! His impact on Bucknell students attending First Presbyterian was incalculable.

It was not uncommon for me to step up to the pulpit on a Sunday morning and find a note under the microphone with the word 'REPENT! (But you may disregard if you have already done so!)"

"The youthful Dick Merritt (34), his even younger, supportive wife, "Flossie," and their little girls, Heather and Gwen, injected a lively, loving presence into the life of the Lewisburg church, manse, and fellowship for over a decade from the mid-60's to mid-70's. The year in which we experienced Dick's pastorate was a formative year in the life of our family. Dick's preaching captivated us. It was intellectually vigorous, rich in scripture and literature, and spiritually challenging. Dick Merritt steadied our faith, which was nurtured further by a small-group circle of new friends. God rest his soul."

"Nearly every afternoon Dick would take the family dog for a walk down Market Street and back, picking up the daily newspaper and making the inevitable stops for conversation along the way. He also frequented the adult softball games at Wolfe Field. Not an athlete himself, he loved sports at all levels, especially minor league baseball." Jim Zaiser

"I can sum up my most vivid memories of Dick Merritt in two words: 'No!' and 'Yes!' When confronted with a discordant denominational decision, Dick's voice thundered "No! No! No!" No one doubted where he stood. On the other hand, when 5-7 students showed up for the inaugural year of Intervarsity at Bucknell, Dick persisted as a "missionary" on campus, saying "Yes! Yes! Yes!" to growing Christians at Bucknell. By Year 3, 75 students were attending, and many of those students, including Tim Keller, attended services at First Presbyterian." J. William "Bill" Moore


