I know many are wondering about our congregation and our current denominational status. Some are frustrated that we haven't taken action to leave the PC(USA), others don't think there are significant reasons to leave. This is a difficult issue, and that is why we are taking our time in the discernment process.

The Discernment Task Force, which is still open to everyone who wants to be involved, has been meeting regularly. They have been developing ways for us to proceed in the discernment process.

Why is this taking so long? It is an important decision, something that should not be done in haste, and we need to be sure that everyone gets the opportunity to be heard. On Sunday May 1 you will be hearing more about where we are in this process. There will be a combined Sunday school class and my sermon will address the denominational issue.

There will be increasing congregational wide involvement in the coming weeks. The leadership wants to have a good understanding of the congregation's knowledge and interest in the denominational issue.

In the next couple of weeks there will be a survey for members to take. It will be available both online and hardcopy. Please be on the lookout for this and take it when you get the opportunity. Everyone's voice is important.

My hope is that through this process, that has the potential to be very divisive, we I encourage you to be here on May 1 for both Sunday school and worship. You are an important part in this process, the church leadership and we want your voice to be heard in this matter. I ask you to fully participate in the process.

The Sunday School lesson was, "All things come from God." One fourteen-year-old, a talented pianist, insisted, "I deserve credit for all the hours I've spent learning to play." I understood his young point of view, but I hope that the intervening years have helped him to be grateful for the gift of an extraordinary talent. Don't we adults struggle to give all the credit to God? Doing so takes a commitment to recognizing God's grace at every turn of our lives. And we must do this as we live in a culture of self-congratulation.

How can we turn our attention from ourselves to God? The Apostle Paul says that we should boast, but boast in the Lord [2 Cor. 10:17], and he describes his road from pride to humility as a crucifixion of self and a new life lived "by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" [Gal. 2:20b]. And what a "giving" that was, Christ's trading His divine status for humble servitude and, ultimately, condescension to death on a cross [Phil. 2:5-8].

Ironically, the desire to live for Christ can itself leave us feeling "puffed up" over our progress. With credit to Tim Keller, here's a helpful prayer reminder: "Lord, I cannot give you anything without remembering that both the thing I am giving you and even the desire to give it to you are both from you anyway! I can never put you in my debt! Because of what Jesus did, I am not my own—I'm bought with a price [1 Cor. 6:19-20]. Let that insight rid me of all grumbling and self-pity" (and I would add, pride). 
