faith in Jesus Christ.



Let us give thanks for God's provision and give thanks for the opportunity to participate in the life changing ministry of Operation Christmas Child.





- 3. Include a hand-written note of encouragement and photo (optional).
- 4. Enclose \$7.00 or more inside your box to help cover shipping costs overseas. Checks are recommended and should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse.
- 5. **Bring your filled shoeboxes** to the church for Shoebox Sunday November 23rd. If you are unable to make it to the church that day, our church is also a Collection Center. Drop it off Nov. 17-21 from 10-7.


