### From the Pastor:

The beginning of the school year seems much more like a time of new beginnings than January first does. I am excited about our ministries that are gearing up for the fall.

A few years ago we were struggling with children's Sunday school, and children's ministry as a whole. Some neighboring churches in the same situation shut down their Sunday school. We hired a Director of Children's ministry and the ministry to our children, including Sunday school, has grown. We face the challenge of needing more Sunday school teachers for our children. Is God calling you to this vital and vibrant ministry?

A year ago we knew that adult Sunday morning classes were not as well attended as they historically had been. Many churches have ceased offering adult Sunday school. We poured some increased energy into our adult Sunday School and our congregation responded. This fall we have new teachers and new class offerings and a higher level of interest and enthusiasm for our adult education. Which class will you be attending?

We live in a culture that is decreasing in their Christian participation, education, and identification. Many congregations are on the decline. We can either join them, or through God's power and inspiration fight against the trends, address the challenges before us, and seek to grow in our Christian life both individually and collectively.

My goals for this fall are

to bring greater clarity to who we are as a church: our identity, our core believes, our mission, and our vision. There are actually many churches that are growing and thriving, just not many that are 182 years old and members of a mainline denomination. Certainly God is able to continue to bless our congregation, even bring a refreshing spirit to our ongoing work and life together.

### The "Apples" of Our Eyes

I love late August and early Septemtime of departures and new beginnings for our church family and for the nearly 900 families who stream into our town with packed cars, high anxiety, and eightback tears.

One of our own parents, recently returned from settling his daughter on her campus, reported this comment: "I know I'm in the right place and doing what I should be doing—but I wish that you guys could stay." On the other hand, a male newbie, in conversation a few days before leaving for school, said this about making the break: "I think it should be quick, like tearing off a band-aid."



Taking such an important step requires a dash of bravado on the part of parent and child. Thankfully, in a few weeks our youngsters will have settled in with new friends, new intellectual challenges, and new confidence in living free of daily parental oversight. (How texting, book, and face time affect this transition I will be interested in learning from today's parents.)

Church family, daily let's pray for these students and their families. Get a student's college address and send a note/ email/text or maybe even a package of cookies. Look for them at break time and welcome them home. Get to know our current children and youth, and let them know you are interested them. in Watch for BU students in our pews. Introduce yourselves, and invite them to lunch.

Departing dents, your church family wishes you God-

speed. For many of us parents who endured this transition decades ago, you are now the "apples of our eyes." Take with you your First Presby relationships and experiences-the teaching, prayers, games, service projects, long van rides, and mission projects. Remember how Tim, Lauren, and their adult assistants led you into places where together you modeled the love of Christ. Recall how you felt when you built a wall in Puerto Rico or painted a house in Parma. Ohio.

Enjoy college, but be prepared for times of loneliness, doubt, and discouragement. When those times come, remember the treasure you have in Christ, a gracious gift from God. Put Him first in your lives, give Him all the credit, and rejoice in what He will do, in you and through you, during your college years and beyond.
